MEATLESS MONDAYS QUINOA with ROASTED VEG & TOFU <u>INGREDIENTS</u>

For quinoa

For veg and tofu

1 1/4 cup water 3/4 cup quinoa 1/3 cup raisins 2 tbsp apple cider vinegar 1/4 tsp salt 1 sweet potato (12 oz), peeled and diced into 1//2 in cubes i head broccoli (12 oz), cut into bite size florets 3 tbsp olive oil 1/4 tsp salt *1 (7oz) package teriyaki marinated extra-firm tofu, cut into 1/2 in cubes 10-12 cherry tomatoes 1 small red or orange bell pepper,

1 small red or orange bell pepper, seeded & sliced

For sauce and serving

1/3 cup well-stirred tahini
1/3 cup fresh orange juice
1-2 garlic cloves, minced
or grated
1 tbsp olive oil
1/2 tsp ground turmeric
cold water, as needed
fresh ground black pepper
(optional)
4 springs fresh cilantro
(optional)

You can make your own teriyaki marinade with:

- 1/4 cup soy sauce
- 2 tbsp honey
- 1 tbsp rice vinegar
- 1 clove garlic, minced or grated
- 1 (1 in) piece or fresh ginger, grated

Marinate tofu cubes at room temperature for 30 minutes or up to 12 hrs in fridge.

<u>METHOD</u>

Step 1. Combine quinoa ingredients in small saucepan and bring to boil over high heat. Cover & reduce heat to lowest setting. Cook until quinoa is tender, 18-20 minutes. Remove from heat. Cover & set aside so quinoa stays warm & becomes plush.

Step 2. While quinoa cooks, preheat oven to 400F. Line large sheet pan with foil or parchment, if desired.

Step 3. Toss sweet potato & broccoli w/oil. Season w/salt & spread evenly over 2/3 of pan. Add tofu cubes to other 1/3, spacing everything evenly. Roast for 15 min, then use tongs to toss everything so they cook evenly. Cook another 10-15 minutes, or until potatoes are tender, broccoli is crisped and tofu has browned.

Step 4. To make the sauce, whisk together tahini, orange juice, honey and garlic.

Step 5. In pan over high heat, heat olive oil until it shimmers. Remove from heat & add turmeric, giving it 30 seconds to bloom. Scape & stir turmeric oil into tahini mixture. If too thick to drizzle, add a bit of cold water.

Step 6. To serve, place some quinoa in a bowl. Top w/veg & tofu. Drizzle w/sauce.


